NLEM 2015 Formulations pending for Ceiling price fixation under DPCO 2013 – Manufacturers / Marketing companies requested for information

NPPA has requested Manufacturers / Marketing companies to furnish **Price to Retailer (PTR)** and **Moving Annual Turnover (MAT)** in value terms, duly self attested with proper authorised signature & Seal of the authorized officer of the company, for the formulations mentioned in **Annexure -1** for the month of August 2015 by 22.12.2017 for enabling NPPA to take appropriate action for ceiling price fixation under the provisions of DPCO 2013.

As AIOCD (Pharmatrac) is not capturing the PTR & MAT of these formulations, NPPA has requested concerned Manufacturers / Marketing companies to provide requisite information issuing several Oms from time to time and has not yet fixed the ceiling price for these formulations.

NPPA will proceed with price fixation of these formulations based on other available information if Manufacturers / Marketing companies fail to provide the requisite information.
